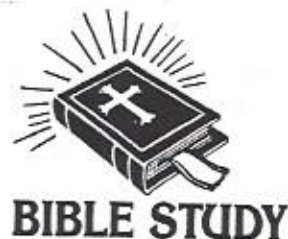

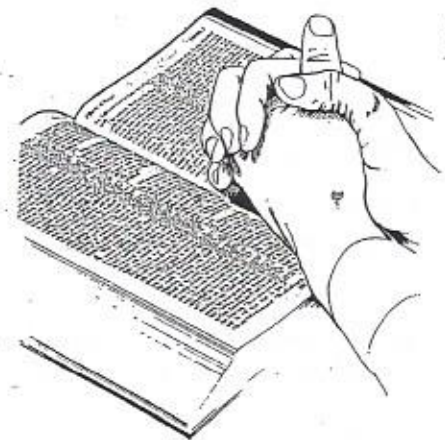

**June 9, 2014**

President Joyce Schoulte called the regular meeting of the St. Peter Church Council to order at 7:35 PM, on June 9, 2014. Present were Samantha Johnson, Dave Lamker, Andy Reimer, Jane Thein, Jim Wilker, Pastor Hillary Burns-Kite and Georgi Kaiser. Absent: NaDyne Meyer.

Pastor Hillary led devotions using d365.org.

**Minutes** of the May 12 meeting were presented. Jane moved, Andy seconded, to accept the minutes as printed. Motion carried.

**Financial Report** was presented by Georgi. Discussion was held on negative change in receipts and expenses from prior year. Council directed Georgi to provide a "giving" vs expense status report in the bulletin monthly. Dave moved and Samantha seconded to accept the Financial Report as printed. Motion carried.

**Old Business:**

1. Copyright Licensing: Pastor reported St. John Guttenberg's current copyright license status. The CCLI at \$116 per year was recommended. Andy made the motion to purchase the CCLI licensing, Jim seconded. Motion carried.
2. Church Custodian Position: Joyce reported that no one to date had approached her with interest in the position. Potential candidates to approach were discussed. Job Description duties related to worship services were discussed. Decision made to move responsibility for ringing the church bell to the ushers and responsibility for turning on/off the sound system and setting out the hearing impaired devices for worship to the Organist/Pianist and/or Pastor. Andy made the motion, Dave seconded to set the starting wage at \$8.00 per hour.

**New Business:**

1. Constitution/By-Laws: Council set August 3 following worship (10:45) till noon as a "work meeting to specifically address review and revisions needed in the Constitution and Bylaws. Preliminary work was done by Jane Thein, Kevin Clefish and Susan Kuenzel.
2. Congregational Meeting: The July semi-annual meeting is being planned for July 20. Election of new council members will be on the agenda. Joyce and Andy's terms will end January 2015.
3. Council member resignation: Dave Lamker offered his council position resignation effective July due to a job change that will prevent him from attending any evening council meetings. A replacement to complete Dave's term (thru Jan 2016) will need to be elected at the July congregational meeting.

1. Air cleaning: ServPro has completed the air cleaning of the church. Air samples taken post cleaning indicated the church air is almost as clean as an operating room.
2. Water issues: Donald Backhaus reported to Joyce that Friday June 13, workmen will start digging around the Sunday School addition on the east side to identify what action is needed to address the water drainage and seepage issues.
