Food for thought: *Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.* - John 4: 13 & 14

Jesus is our living water; our first and most efficient source of life. Jesus satisfies our thirsts in ways water, food, other people and money never could.

During these next few weeks of stewardship emphasis, we will imagine together ways in which we, as congregations and individuals, can use our resources to contribute to making the living water known locally and globally. Through the living water of Christ we are called, encountered and satisfied by His gifts of word, presence and healing in our lives. I would encourage each household to designate a "Living Water" jar in your house. These jars are for collecting loose change and donations, which will be gathered together at the end of the month and given to an organization working to provide clean water systems and accessibility to them in developing communities around the world.

As we think of all that we are thankful for, let us be mindful of all the ways water plays a role in our lives. How can we be good stewards of water? Let us also remember the gifts we are given through the Living Water, which sustain our lives now and into eternity. How can we act upon our gratitude?

Stewardship - St. Peter's stewardship emphasis will begin Sunday, October 26th, and conclude on Sunday, November 23rd. We will be using the "Living Water" program from Logos Productions with three foci: Named, Encountered, Satisfied. We will spend two Sundays on each emphasis using images, scriptures, prayer, songs and activities. Come explore with us how the Living Water informs our lives as stewards of creation.

Pumpkin Patch Fun - Saturday, November 1st, I am planning a fun afternoon of fall activities for the children in our congregations. There will be games, snacks and pumpkins. Children are invited to come in costume, if they are not tired of wearing it already. The plan is to gather at the FRB Garden by the Garnavillo Community Cemetery at 2 pm. In case of inclement weather, we will move the event to the basement of St. Peter Church. Kids of all ages are welcome to participate. ☺

Veterans Meal - The Ministry and Outreach committee at St. Peter is organizing a Veteran's breakfast for Saturday, November 8th. They will be looking for donations of food ingredients for the menu. Look for a sign-up sheet coming around during worship, if you would like to contribute.

Come to the Castle - This is a bible study series being offered by Wartburg Seminary in Dubuque. It is being offered for both laity and clergy. There is one event still open this fall; Friday, November 21st. A bible study is held for laity and led by senior master's students. At the same time, a text study is held for clergy, led by faculty. This is a full day event beginning with chapel at 9:30, followed by two sessions of the bible study. Lunch is included in the cost of the event; \$20/ person or \$50/ group of 5 people. 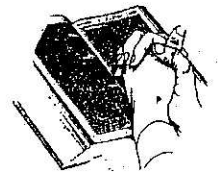

Thanks to Marlene Kamienski for donating a box of sheets for our quilt projects.

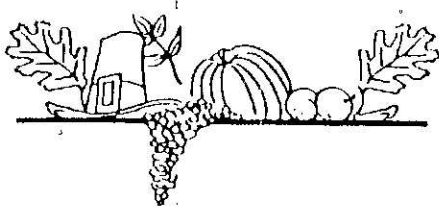
Next Marys and Marthas will be hosted by Karilyn McArthur at Peace Church November 12, at 5:00 p.m.

A Visit to the LWR Warehouse

Earlier this year, Marie Weber of Bethany, Elkader, and her husband visited the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) warehouse in St. Paul, Minn., where mission quilts and kits from the Northeastern Iowa Synod are delivered.

In November and May, the warehouse is full of LWR donations, which include school kits, personal care kits, baby kits and soap. Staff spend the next six months preparing the quilts and kits for shipment.

The quilts and kits are sorted and repackaged into boxes or bales the precise size to fill every square inch of a shipping container. The cost to ship a container is the same if it is full or empty, so everything is packaged to a specific size to ensure the container is filled to capacity.

"It's wonderful to see the dedication and commitment of

everybody in the whole process, from the people making the quilts to those delivering the quilts to the man running the warehouse," Weber said.

According to Lutheran World Relief, from Oct. 1, 2013, to Sept. 24, 2014, the Minnesota warehouse has processed about 183,420 quilts, 142,905 school kits, 83,195 personal care kits, and 34,800 baby care kits.

One 40-foot shipping container can hold 12,375 quilts. Since October 2013, quilts and kits have departed the Minnesota warehouse en route to Chad, Yemen, Cambodia, India, Lebanon, Serbia, Myanmar, Nicaragua, Peru, Angola, and Burkina Faso.

Women's Gifts to LWR

During the year 2013 through the spring of 2014, the women of the Northeastern Iowa Synod gave to Lutheran World Relief:

- 10,727 mission quilts
- 3,292 personal care kits
- 4,209 school kits
- 342 fabric kits
- 2,541 baby care kits
- 833 lbs. of soap
- 143 blankets

Project Sweet Dreams

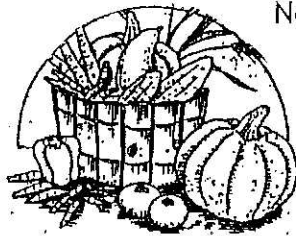
